#### **November Club rides**

#### **UPDATE:Second Groups for Listed Ride**

If a listed ride has filled a qualified ride leader can form a second ride group. NOTE: at the September club meeting it was decided that second ride groups must start a half hour before or after the original posted ride. This is in response to the Covid upsurge and to avoid the inevitable merging of groups that has occurred.

#### **Note to Ride Leader and Riders**

If you are having any trouble registering for a ride listed on the club calendar, contact the ride leader and/or contact me, Dan Scott, current rides coordinator at:

In the late fall/early winter weather certainly impacts many rides. Be sure to check Ride Updates or contact the ride leader if you have any question as to whether a ride is a "Go" or not.

Ride leaders, try to make your 'go/no go' decision early enough for those who signed up to be informed. Then follow the directions for canceling;

Ride / Event Cancellation:

"If the ride / event is cancelled for everyone for whatever reason do not delete the ride / event. Instead:

- 1. Add the word "CANCELLED:" in front of the ride/event title through the Events List page. There is no need to cancel Registrants, who shall remain not checked-in.
- 2. Disable Registration near the top left of the page.
- Send a cancellation e-mail to Registrants through the Events List page using the Basic and Simple options or use the Wild Apricot Admin app.."
