Bicycle Technical Info

Appreciating Sheldon Brown!

Although I always had a bike with me all my life, it wasn't until I hit 50, when my knees sent a clear message that jogging was no longer for me that I stepped up to a Cannondale R200 and started racking up 50 – 100 miles a week in the season. This was around 2003, so the web was already a thing, and my need for bike knowledge took me to the website treasure trove of SheldonBrown.com.

Sheldon was a master wrench, philosopher and an early internet influencer possessing in-depth information and profound opinions on everything bicycle related. He worked at Harris Cyclery in New England. For any biking question you might have, SheldonBrown.com has information to get you started. Wanting to do as much of my own bike maintenace as possible, I often turned to his site to find out about tire sizes, wheel building, saddle fitting, fender mounting and on and on. His saddle-page alone has 19 subtopics! Gearing, always a favorite topic for bike geeks, gets in depth treatment on Sheldon's Gear Calculator-page is a classic that is referenced from many other sources.

Sheldon died in 2008 at just 64, just a few years after I found his site, but SheldonBrown.com lives on, maintained by a crew of volunteers so keep it up to date with new articles, blog entries and more. There is even a Sheldon Brown Facebook page, which surely didn't exist in his lifetime.

The site does have one "problem" for me. Often when I go there to look something up I find a half hour has gone by reading his fascinating articles and I've forgotten whatever I originally searched for. If you haven't visited his site before, take a look and in addition to "cranking up" your biking knowledge you are sure to be entertained by his worldly philosophy.

ideas, and not just some cheesy cheap things off of Amazon. (He's got a list of those things, too.)

Without further ado, here it is, the Cyclist's Gifting Dozen!

- Park Tool Pizza Cutter #PZT-2. Don't get PZT-1 as the -2 version is a significant upgrade.
- •Smartwool Neck Gator. It comes in a multitude of colors and patterns. Besides looking stylish, they can act as a deterrent to vampires. (They don't like wool.)
- Any Spurcycle Bell. The Wrench believes all bikes should have a bell and this is the best one, bar none. Do your homework and get one which fits the handlebar diameter.
- A torque wrench which can handle 2 15 Nm, or somewhere in that range. This is especially critical for those with carbon anythings.
- How about some personalized labels for the bike, helmet, or anywhere else? Check out VeloInk.com.
- Anything Castelli. This Italian clothing brand just oozes style.
- Garmin Varia radar. There are three versions: Video/Light/Radar, Light/Radar, or Radar only. It's like having a set of eyes always looking behind you. If your cyclist has a nice GPS computer (Garmin, Wahoo) and doesn't have a radar unit, this could literally be a life saver.
- For the Euro-artsy types, check out <u>cyclingsouvenirs.com</u>. They ship to the USA, as The Wrench well knows.
- Go to the Sharing Wheels open house and bid/buy one of the craftsman- or craftswoman-made velo-art projects. They are guaranteed to be unique and cool.
