December Rides: Weekends & Weekdays

WEEKDAY RIDES

Tuesdays, December 1, 8, 15, 22, 29 – PreRide to the Noon Ride

10:30am start, routes will vary. These loop rides are set up to return riders for the start of the Silver Lake Noon
Rides. Food stop follows the Noon ride. Distance 12 -15 mile loops, A/B terrain, low-moderate pace with regroups.
Ride leaders Dan Scott 425-501-6198, Rick Proctor 425-293-3153. Heavy rain cancels. Call if in doubt.

Tuesdays, December 1, 8, 15, 22, 29 – Silver Lake Noon Rides

Join BIKES for a short Silver Lake and Mill Creek loop. Meet at Silver Lake Bicycle Centre for a 12pm start. Social pace (10-12mph), 10 miles, A terrain with just a few very very very short climbs (like less than one block each). Optional coffee after the ride. Nasty weather cancels the ride, but not the coffee – please check the Ride Updates page before leaving home, or contact ride leader. Ride leader Mike Dahlstrom, mike.dahlstrom@frontier.com.

Thursdays, December 3, 10 & 17—Giro di Sentieri Meet at McCollum Park west parking lot for an 11am start. Loop ride ncluding sections of the Interurban, Burke-Gilman, Sammamish River, and North Creek trails and interconnecting streets. Coffee, lunch, and rest stops expected. 34 miles, steady pace (12 – 14 mph), A & B terrain. Ride leader Rick Proctor 425-293-3153. Ice, snow, or steady rain cancels, check the Rides Updates page or call/text if in doubt.

WEEKEND RIDES

Sunday, December 6—Ride to Redmond & Molbaks

This is a fun, mostly trail ride to lunch at QFC in Redmond. On our way back we will detour through Woodinville to admire the beautiful displays at Molbaks and partake in some complimentary, traditional Kringle and coffee. We may even get to gather 'round Santa for a fun group photo! Pace is high social and mostly A, very little B terrain. About 25 miles. Nasty weather cancels which includes rain, showers, and temps under 40 degrees. If in doubt please check Ride Updates or contact Ride Leader Allyson Welsh at 206 356-8134. Hope you can join us!

<u>Sunday, December 13 (7th day of Hanukah) - Doughnut Ride</u> Meet at Bicycle Centres of Everett, Silver Lake Location for a 12:30pm start. Donuts being a traditional treat for this ancient holiday, lets ride to Mill Creek to visit Frost Doughnuts. About 15 miles, Social Pace, terrain B. Ride leader Gery Osowiecki, 469-358-2887. Extremely cold weather (less than 40 degrees), steady rain, ice, or snow cancels the ride. But please come to the donut shop anyway, unless it's really unsafe. If conditions look iffy, please check Ride Updates page before leaving home, or text/call Gery to confirm.

Friday, December 18 – Decorated Bike Ride Meet at the Northeast corner of Garfield Park in Everett (2 blocks East of Walnut on 23rd Street) for a 6:30pm start. Light your bike, tinsel yourself, or grow a tree on your rack. It's time for a Christmas light viewing ride around Everett. A 5-10 mile leisurely ride around town. This is a night ride, headlight and taillight required, decorations are optional (but fun). Snow, ice and/or heavy rain will postpone, watch ride changes page for updates. Saturday, December 19 – Round the River Everett to Snohomish Starting at Emerson ES in Everett, south parking lot at 10am. A relatively short loop involving parts of the Interurban Trail, climb up to Paine Field, and stop at a nice little "mom and pop" donut shop on 112th St. About 12 miles, Social Pace, terrain mostly A, a little bit of B. Ride leader Gery Osowiecki, 469-358-2887. Extremely cold weather (less than 40 degrees), steady rain, ice, or snow cancels the ride. But please come to the nearby L'Artisan Bakery anyway, unless it's really unsafe. If conditions look iffy, please check Ride Updates page before leaving home or text/call Gery to confirm.

TERRAIN

"A" Mostly flat: Flat or gentle grades only (trails, Norman Rd)

"B" Rolling: Most climbs are short and easy (Granite Falls, Kitsap)

"C" Hills: Frequent steeper and/or longer hills (Whidbey Island)

"D" Difficult: Many hills, long, steep grades (RAMROD, mt. pass)

Pace is based on speed on flat ground. Contact the Ride Leader if you are unsure whether a ride is right for you.

Bicycle Safety: It's Everybody's Responsibility

It's every bicycle riders worst nightmare, and one that came close to home.

Accident on Today's Ride

Words you never want to see in an email subject.

From Bob Nyberg: About 10:20 am on Nov 4, I joined up with Mason Rutledge near the 52nd St PUD substation on the Interurban trail for his listed ride ... Mason's front wheel touched my rear tire and he went down hard. He was laying face down in the middle of the lane unconscious for about 1 - 2 minutes. I called 911 and his wife Brenda.

From Mason (a few days later): Thanks for everything. My face is healing quickly. No broken bones just a dislocated (painful) shoulder and a brain that needs rest. Bike is okay too. Helmet is totaled.

From Dan Scott (upon reflection): This is, unfortunately, a good reminder to all of us who lead rides to carry a copy of the club accident and insurance forms as well as completed sign-up sheets. I know I've been a bit lax at times about the sign up process; I need to be more insistent about emergency contact numbers too, including my own.

From Kristin Kinnamon: Bottom line, bicycling is relatively safe when done with skill and awareness, but crashes can and do happen. On club rides we prepare for but seek to prevent crashes by:

- · Reviewing rules of the road before all rides
- · Collecting emergency contact info on sign-in
- Wearing a helmet not a cure-all, but it sure can help (see above!)
- Following group riding etiquette like pointing out obstacles
- Having insurance and carrying the accident form to complete if needed.

Our insurance protects the club from liability, and it also can help injured riders with medical coverage if costs exceed their other policies. Only members and first-time guests are covered by club insurance.

Editor Note: Ride Leaders be sure to carry copies of the club ride info packet with you when leading your rides! Be sure to collect signatures and emergency numbers.
